

VETCAT ENABLED DIAGNOSIS OF INOPERABLE CARCINOMA IN A DOG PRESENTING WITH OTITIS EXTERNA

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A 14 year old dog presented with right external otitis externa visible upon examination.

A VetCAT CT scan was taken to evaluate the extent of the pathology (Figure 1).

The lesion was found to be obliterating the canal, middle and inner ear.

Soft tissue inflammation was also visible on the VetCAT CT.

Bony expansion and diffuse borders were indicative of adenocarcinoma or squamous cell carcinoma.

It was decided that treatment would be too invasive.
